

## Justice for Corruption

Even though corruption scandals are discovered everyday, very few finally end with a prosecution. Largely because officers don't follow up on the cases. The following RTI application forces the Vigilance Commissions to prosecute such cases properly. Use the application so that justice is done against the corrupt.

List of all complaints received by the CVC during the period 1.1.05 to 31.12.05 containing brief description of complaint, whether complaint was anonymous, date of complaint, details (name and designation) of official or authority complained against. 2. Which of the above complaints were rejected immediately and which ones were taken up for subsequent investigations? Date of initiating investigations or brief reasons for rejecting, as the case may be. Which one of those taken up for subsequent investigations, have been closed? Brief reasons for closing each one of them. 3. According to various laws, guidelines, rules, procedures, manuals etc, in how much time should an investigation be completed after its receipt at CVC? Please provide copies of such guidelines, which prescribe time limits for various stages starting from receipt of a complaint up to filing of prosecution or imposition of penalties. 4. How many total cases have been received in the Commission since 1.4.02. How many of them were rejected immediately and which ones were taken up for subsequent investigations?
